

Peter Gunn would be appalled. The Rev Peter Gunn was a missionary from Wick in Scotland to the Gaelic speakers of the Heidelberg district of Melbourne. He was the first minister of the Scots Church in Heidelberg, located then at a barn in Bulleen, from 1843-1845. Portrait photos of previous ministers of the congregation until 2017 hang in the new 'gallery space' behind the Sycamore tree: all except for Peter Gunn. Gunn came from a generation of Presbyterians who took so seriously the command that there should be no images of the invisible God that this injunction should also include any depiction of humans, for they are created in the image of God.

Even if Peter Gunn could get over the iniquity that all his collegial successors agreed to have their images displayed in his church it is difficult to imagine the apoplexy he would suffer on learning that not one, but two of his successors painted icons in the tradition of the Eastern Orthodox churches. One of whom, Rev. Dr Peter Blackwood, teaches iconography under the tutelage of two Russian iconographers. Another, Rev. Sandy Brodine, is proud to call Peter Blackwood her teacher.

Times have changed, and our understanding of the nature of icons and how they can aid us in our spiritual connection to the Divine have grown. Come on in and explore!




The Beauty of Holiness

Since his retirement in 2013 Peter Blackwood has painted icons. Peter was invited to help lead the Uniting Church Icon Schools. His lack of confidence and competence for coaching others in the craft of painting Byzantine icons drove him to find professional teachers and to increase his skill by painting icons of the people of faith listed in the Uniting Church's Calendar Other of Commemorations.

The result is a collection of photos of over 100 icons and an account of a journey of discovery made over twenty years of painting icons in egg tempera.

The Artists



Rev. Dr Peter Blackwood is a retired minister who served 25 years in congregations including Heidelberg-East Ivanhoe. He began painting icons while serving in presbytery and synod placements. From 2013 Peter has volunteered as administrator and teacher with the Uniting

Church Icon Schools. He has been a student of two iconographers from St Petersburg (now living in exile in Georgia), Philip Davydov and Olga Shalamova.



Rev. Sandy Brodine is a minister in the Younger Generations Team of the Synod of Victoria and Tasmania. She was previously a Minister in the Banyule Network of Uniting Churches. Sandy enjoys all things creative and has a passion for encouraging people to engage creatively in their faith. She has been painting icons for 7 years

under the instruction of Peter Blackwood. Sandy is married to Brendan and has a thirteen year old daughter, Sophia.
